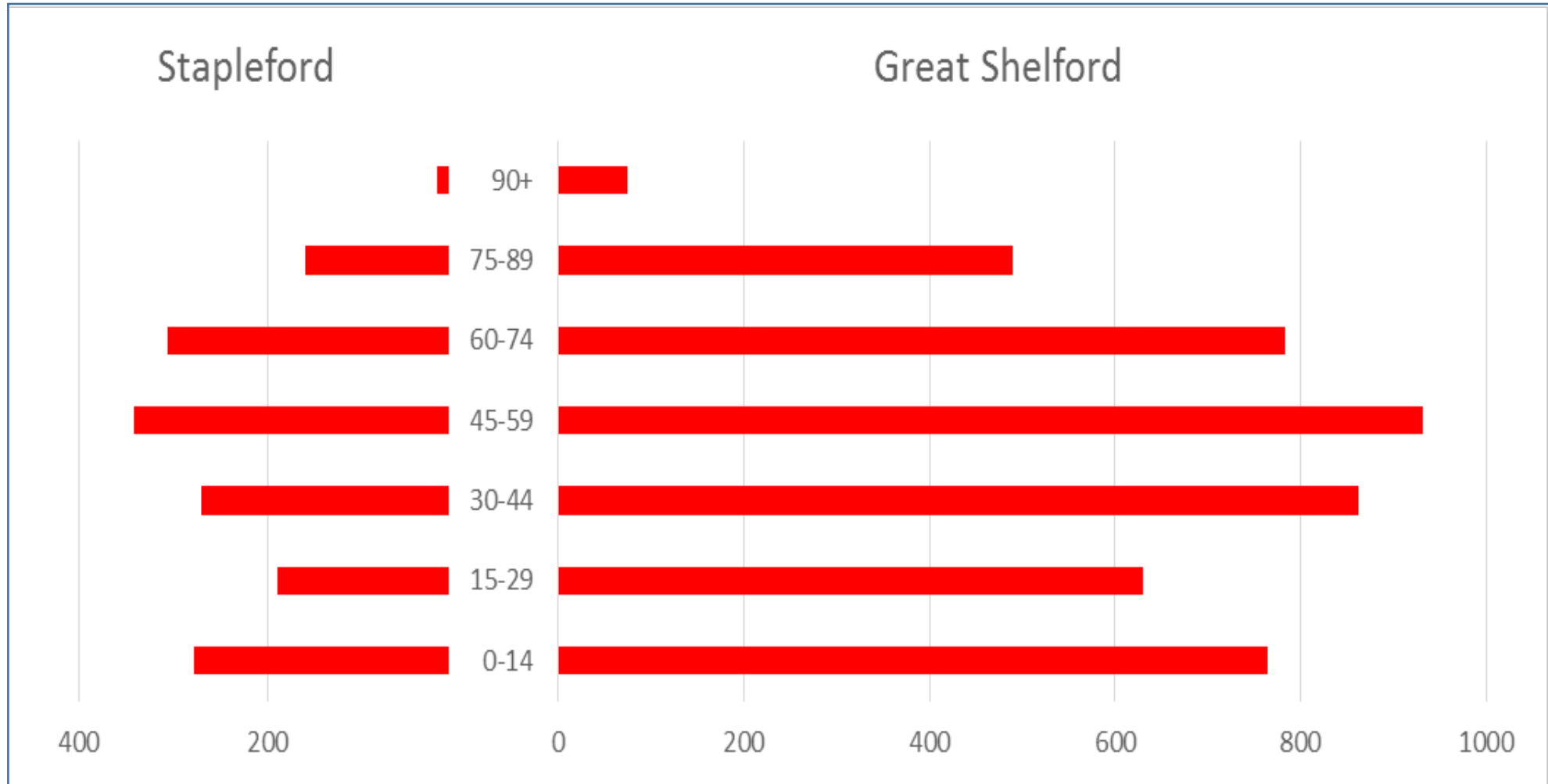
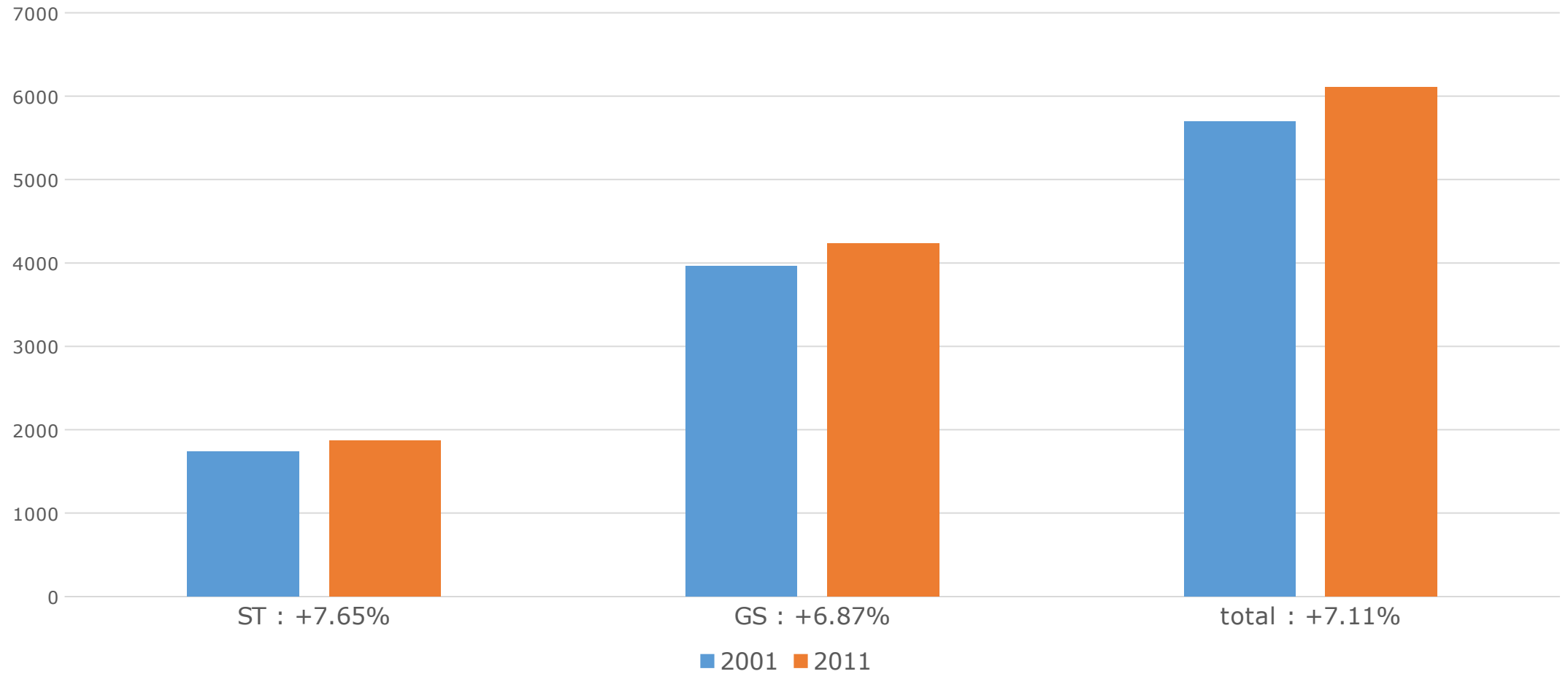


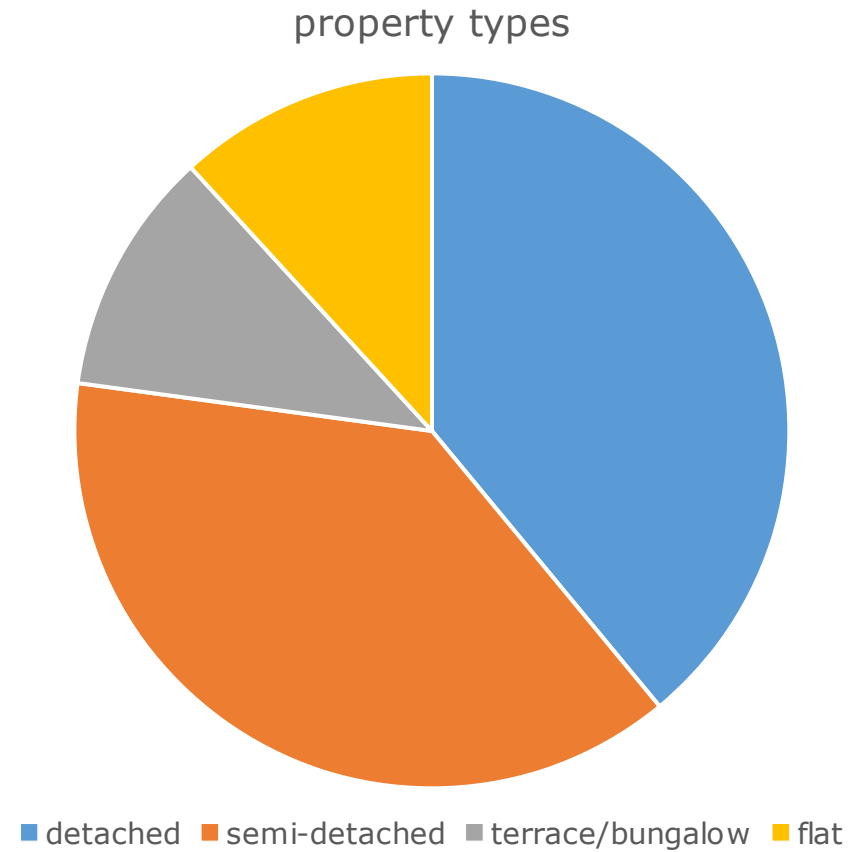
# Population Age Structure (2011 census)



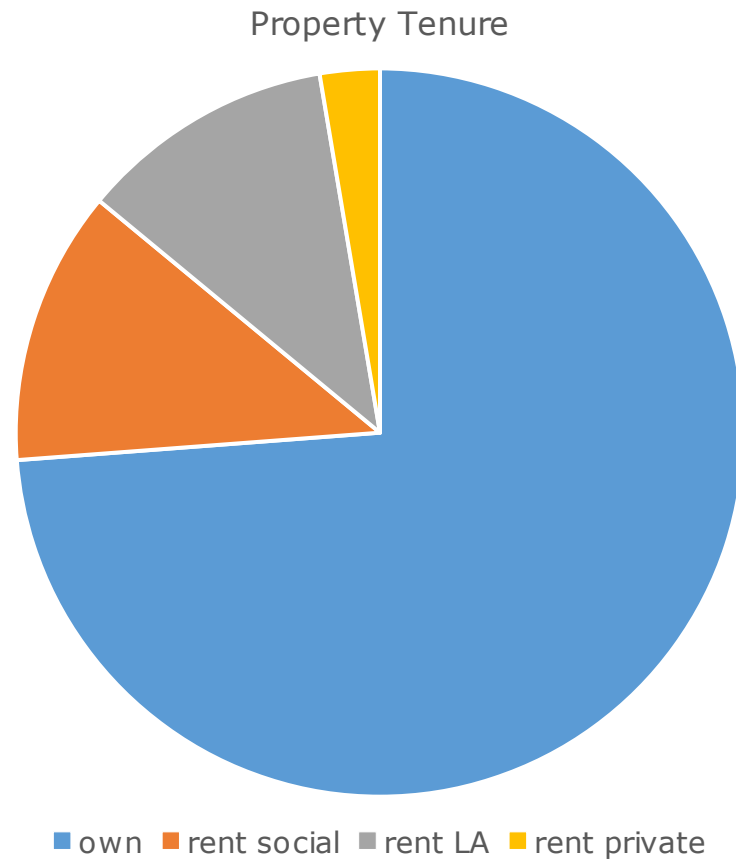
# Population Evolution



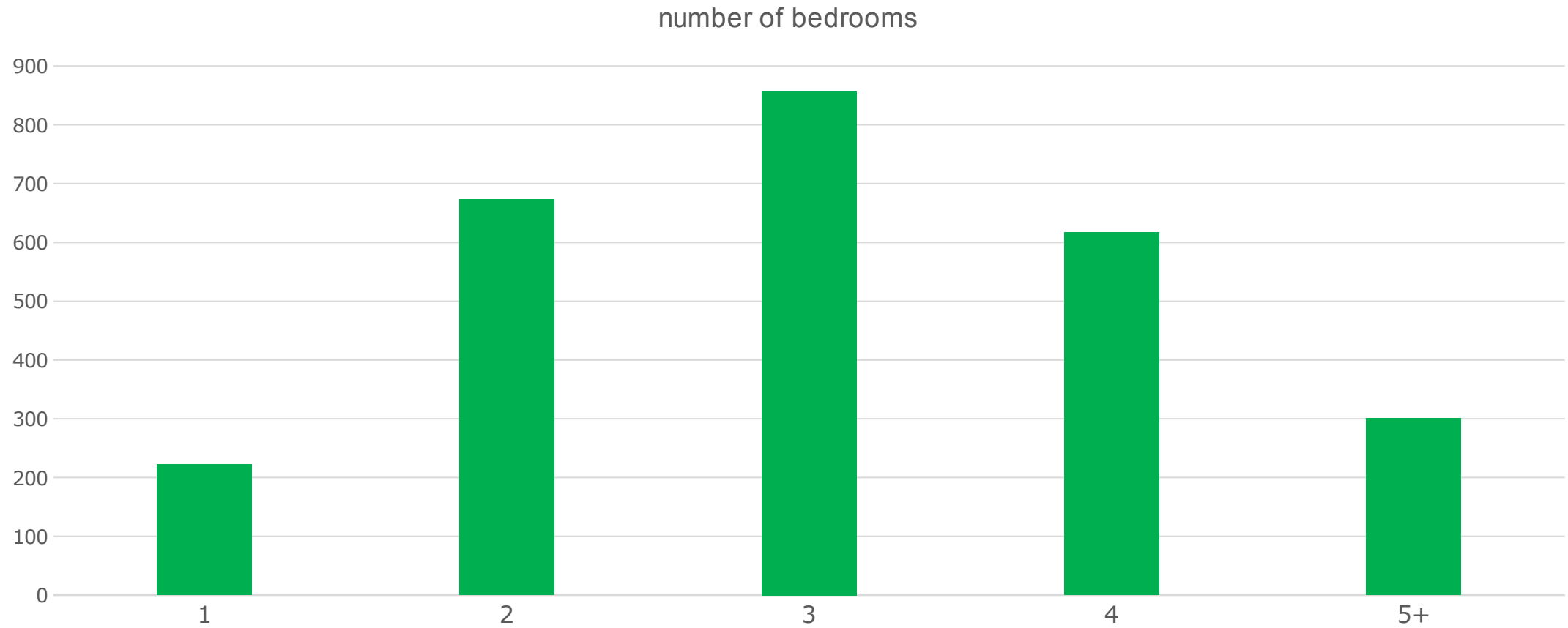
77% of households are detached or semi-detached...



...and 74% are owned rather than rented

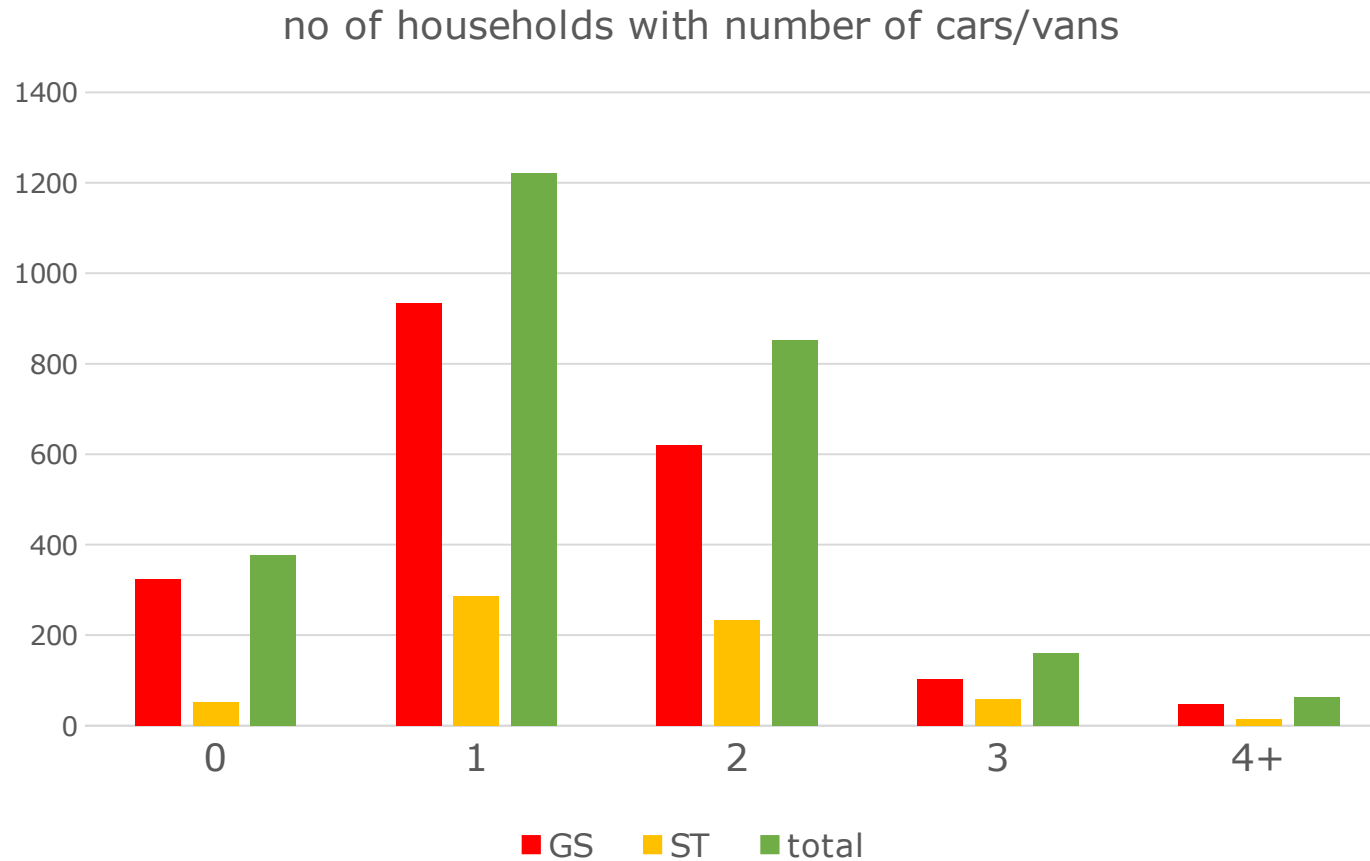


# A majority have three or more bedrooms



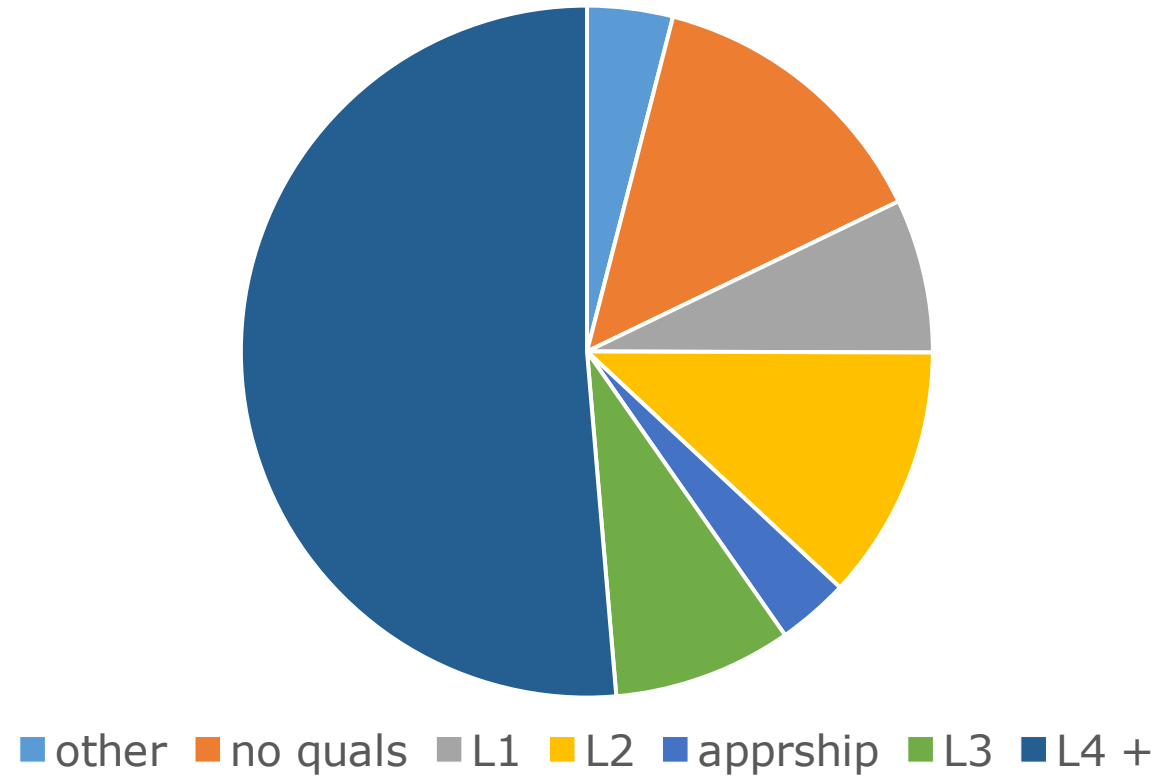
# Access to car or van

This rises to 92% for Stapleford taken in isolation.

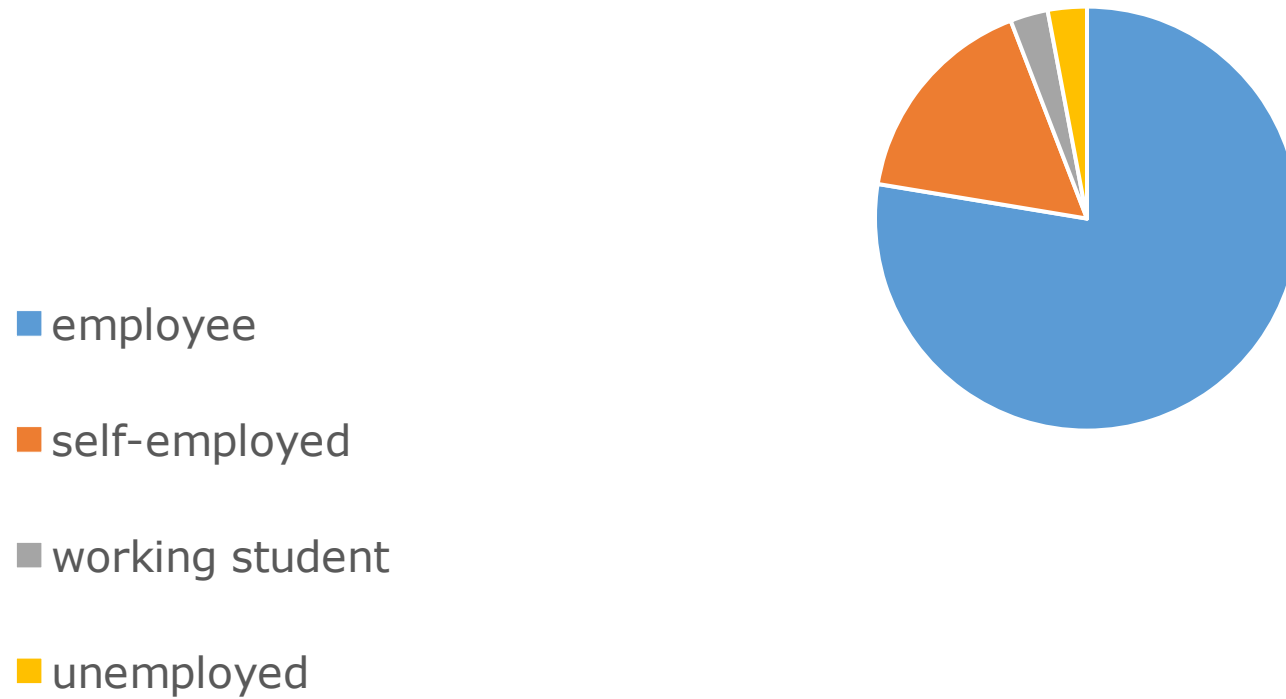


# A well-qualified workforce

# Employment status (economically active population)

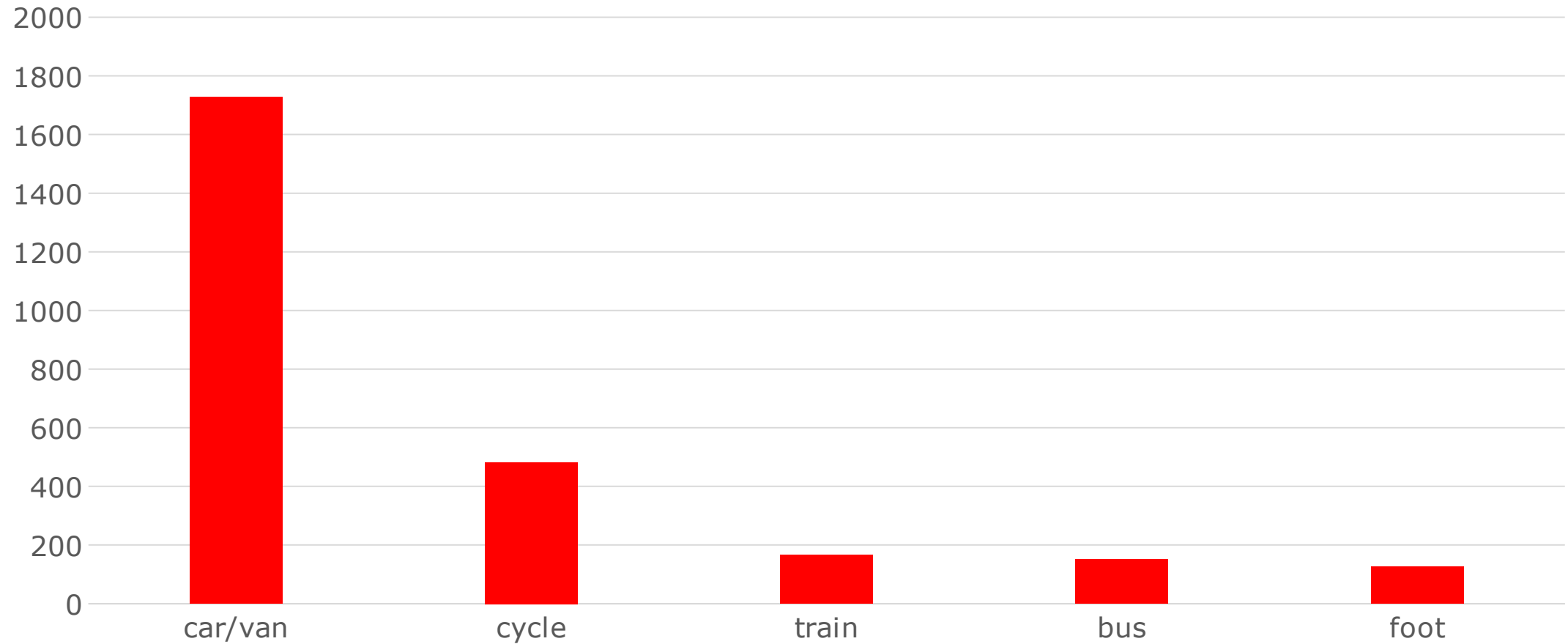




# How far we travel to work...

# Where residents work

The 2011 census showed around 3000 residents employed.

- 420 work mainly or wholly at home
- A further 191 work within our two parishes
- 1207 in Cambridge City
- 596 in South Cambridgeshire (not including our two parishes)
- 115 in various London boroughs
- 471 elsewhere, including 'no fixed place'

# Where workers live

In the 2011 census, about 1980 people declared their workplace lay in the NP area. Of these 1980 -

- 420 worked at home
- 191 lived within Stapleford and Great Shelford
- 603 elsewhere within South Cambridgeshire
- 250 in Cambridge City
- 14 in various London boroughs
- about 500 elsewhere

# Shelford station usage

Shelford had 159920 entrances and exits in 2014-15.

This puts it 1471st out of 2539 stations in the UK.

Cambridge station is about 65 times busier, and  
Whittlesford about 3 times as busy.
